#### PRESIDENT'S SECRETARIAT

New Delhi, the 17th June 1960

No. 32-Pres./60.—The President is pleased to approve the following designs for the medals, their ribbons and clasps, the institution of which was notified in a Gazette of India Extraordinary on the 26th January 1960 under this Secretariat's notifications Nos. 14 to 19 Pres./60.

#### I, THE "SAINYA SEVA MEDAL"/"SERVICES MEDAL"

- 1. Medal.—The medal shall be circular in shape made of cupro-nickel, 85 millimetres in diameter and fitted to a plain horizontal bar with standard fitting. It shall have embossed on its obverse an outline of Nanda Devi Peak in the background with a clump of bamboo in the foreground. On the reverse it shall have an Indian Fort and the inscrip-
- "सैन्य सेना मेडल" embossed along the upper rim.
- 2. Ribbon.—The ribbon shall be \$2 millimetres in width and shall be saffron with two vertical stripes of white and dark green dividing it into three equal parts.
- 3. Clasps-Clasp J & K.-Shall be a bar 32 millimeters long with a Chinar leaf embossed in the centre and the inscription "जम्मू" and "कदमीर" on either side.

Clasp NEFA.-Shall be a bar 32 millimetres long in the shape of four sections of bamboo with the inscription "नी" in one and "51" in the other of the two middle sections

Clasp HIMALAYA.—Shall be a bar 32 millimetres long with a pine cone embossed in the centre and the inscription "हिमा" and "लया" on either side.

## II. THE "VIDESH SEVA MEDAL"/"OVERSEAS MEDAL"

- 1. Medal.—The medal shall be circular in shape, made of cupro-nickel, 35 millimetres in diameter and fitted to a plain horizontal bar with standard fitting. It shall have embossed on its obverse a warship of ancient times. On its reverse it shall have a swelling ocean in the centre and the inscription "विवेश सेवा मैडल" embossed along the upper
- 2. Ribbon.—The ribbon shall be 32 millimetres in width and shall be cobalt blue with five vertical stripes of white dividing it into six equal parts.
- 3. Claps.—These shall consist of bars 32 millimetres long with a frosted background and burnished borders. Each clasp shall have inscribed on it, in raised and burnished characters in Hindi, the name of the place for service in which it has been awarded.

#### THE "SENA MEDAL"/"ARMY MEDAL"

- 1. Mcdal.—The medal shall be circular in shape, made of standard silver. 35 millimetres in diameter. The mounting shall be a fixed ring attached to a metal strip 3 millimetres wide, ornamented with Ashoka leaves, it shall have embossed on its obverse a bayonet, point upwards. On its reverse it shall have an armed sentry and the inscription "सैन। मैडल"embossed along the upper rim.
- 2. Ribbon.—The ribbon shall be 32 millimetres in width and shall be red with a thin silvergrey stripe down the centre.

#### THE "NAO SENA MEDAL"/"NAVY MEDA

- 1. Medal.—The medal shall be pentangular in shape with curved sides, made of standard silver, 85 millimetres in diameter. The mounting shall be a fixed ring attached to a metal strip 3 millimetres wide, ornamented with Ashoka leaves. It shall have embossed on its obverse the Naval crest. On its reverse it shall have a trident within a circlet of rope and the inscription " नोमेना मैडल " embossed along the upper rim
- 2. Ribbon.-The ribbon shall be 32 millimetres in width and shall be navy blue with a thin silver-grey stripe down the centre.

## V. THE "VAYU SENA MEDAL"/"AIR FORCE MEDAL"

1. Medal.—The medal shall be a four pointed star, made of standard silver, 35 millimetres in diameter. The mounting shall be a fixed ring attached to a metal strip 5 millimetres wide, ornamented with Ashoka leaves. It 3 millimetres wide,

shall have embossed on its obverse the Lion Capital in the centre encircled by a garland of leaves. On its reverse it shall have a representation of a Himalayan Eagle with the inscription "वायु सेन." above and "मैडल" embossed below

2. Ribbon.—The ribbon shall be 32 millimetres in width in alternate stripes of saffron and silver-grey, each 3 millimetres in width, running diagonally from right to left.

### VI. THE "VISHISHT SEVA MEDAL"/"DISTINGUISHED SERVICE MEDAL"

- 1. Medal.—The medal shall be circular in shape, 35 millimetres in diameter and fitted to a plain horizontal bar with standard fitting. Class I of the medal shall be made of gold gilt. Class II of standard silver and Class III of bronze. The medal shall have on its obverse a five pointed star. On its reverse it shall have the Lion Capital and the inscription "विशिष्ट सेव( भैडल" embossed along the upper rim.
- 2. Ribbon.—The ribbon shall be 32 millimetres in width of watered silk in gold with one dark blue stripe down the centre for Class I, gold with two dark blue stripes dividing it into three equal parts for Class II, and gold with three dark blue stripes diving it into four equal parts for Class III.

RESOLUTION

No. 19(40)/60-MIV.-With the rapid increase in the produc-No. 19(40)/60-MIV.—With the rapid increase in the production of iron ore in the country to meet the requirement of expanding steel industry and the export trade, a problem of considerable importance which has arisen is the utilisation of huge quantity of fines which are incidental to mechanized mining. To study this problem the Government of India have decided to set up a Committee, consisting of the following:—

#### 2. Terms of reference.

The Committee will study, and make recommendations on the problem of utilisation of iron ore fines in all its aspects including:—

- extent of fines production and the cost at which these can be procured.
- (2) the various technical processes for agglomeration to render fines fit for steel plants or export together with their economics,
- (3) extent to which fines can be and should be utilised in Indian Steel Plants and the measures for securing this utilisation,
- (4) research facilities and pilot plants,
- (5) the allied problem of a suitable feed for blast furnace and the need to conserve coking coal reserves,

#### 3. Meetings of the Committee and report,

The Committee will meet as often as necessary and will submit its report to Government as early as possible.

#### RESOLUTION

#### New Delhi, the 24th June 1960

No. L.E.Ind. 21(2)/60.—The Government of India constituted a Panel vide this Ministry's Resolution No. L.E. Ind. 21(2)/60 dated the 16th April, 1960 published in Part I, Section 1 of the Gazette of India Extraordinary dated the 16th April, 1960, with a view to assess the likely demand for steel wires, in the types and quantities required by various industries engaged in the manufacture of wire products, for the period 1961—1965 and also to assess the existing wire drawing capacity in the ACSR, wire ropes, electrodes, wood screws, wire netting, bicycles and other industries. The Panel was to submit its report to the Government of India by the 30th June, 1960.
